Spiritual Notes

The Word and The Light

December 2020 finds us surrounded by much uncertainty. The last nine months have been dominated by the impact of Covid-19 and life has been full of fear, uncertainty and restrictions. And then there is Brexit which after all the debates of the previous years is due to take full effect on January 1st. The Christmas season, though, is a time when we can be reminded, as Christians, that we have a sure and certain foundation to our lives. We can have this because there are some significant reasons why Jesus Christ came into the world.

To Save. The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners (1 Tim. 1:15a) is what Paul says. Also we call to mind that His name Jesus means salvation (see Matt. 1:21). Our sins have separated us from our God and are our big problem. He saves us from our sins: Praise Him!

To Give Hope. In a world where we see so much uncertainty, we are those who know we have a future which is guaranteed to be good. It will be good because He is our hope. In 1 Timothy 1:1b Paul speaks of Christ Jesus our hope. We don't look forward optimistically because we believe better times are ahead. We look forward optimistically because Jesus Christ is ahead. Both now and forever; He is ahead. We have this hope because He came and through His cross and resurrection. We read through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, and deliver all those who through fear of death were subject to lifelong slavery (Heb. 2:14b-15). Fear has gone; hope is ahead because of Jesus our Lord.

To Give Eternal Life. He came to bring eternal life to all who believe in Him. We possess that life right now. We are no longer possessors of wrath, but possessors of life. John writes: Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life; whoever does not obey the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God remains on him (John 3:36). Oh glory be to our Lord God. This is surely good news.

To Make a people for Himself. God's love is so profoundly good that God, in their three persons, wanted to share their love with others. The plan of salvation is a people making project. Jesus came to form a people for His own good pleasure (see Titus 2:14). We are the reason He came.

To Obtain a Bride. Christ came that He might have the joy of being bridegroom to a bride. We are the bride of Christ. We are a part of that special bride that our heavenly husband, loves, nourishes and cherishes. That bride He once washed, at the cross, through the washing of water by the Word (see Eph. 5:25-33).

To Fulfil the Plan of God. The whole universe held its breath as to whether the determined plan of God to bring salvation through the seed of the woman (see Gen. 3:16) would be worked out. The whole universe breathed a sigh of relief in the coming, dying, rising and glorifying of Jesus. Salvation has come the Saviour is risen. All is well.

To Bring Glory to God. His highest objective was to honour His Father. He glorifies the Father in all that He did. As He faced the cross with all of its peril His one focus was the glory of God. He could conclude with these words as He wrestled about the events of His cross. "Now is my soul troubled. And what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But for this purpose I have come to this hour.²⁸ Father, glorify your name." (John 12:27-28a)

Oh rejoice this Christmas and by faith come alive. Come in to the good news. Come in to the glorious salvation of sins forgiven and a guaranteed home in heaven. This is so good. So don't let Covid-19 or Brexit keep you from a very Happy Christ-filled Christmas.
