Spiritual Notes

Sin and the Christian

Does a Christian sin? Yes. Should a Christian sin? No. Let us look at the Christian's relationship to sin.

At the cross the one who believes in Jesus has full forgiveness of sins. We are truly "ransomed, healed, restored, forgiven" as the hymn by Henry Lyte says. The blood of Jesus Christ deals with all of our sins; past, present and future. As Paul puts it after having run through the gospel message in the previous chapters of Romans there is now no condemnation for those that are in Christ Jesus (Rom. 8:1). Glorious and wonderful these facts are to us. In Christ Jesus we are perfectly acceptable to God; all our sins is taken away because Jesus died to take them away; praise Him!

However, in God's ordained purpose we are not yet in heaven. In heaven we will have sinless perfection. Alas in this world we still struggle with the reality of the flesh (sinful nature) still being within us pushing us to sin. So John says that we are self deceivers if we say that we are without sin: If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us (1 John 1:8).

Whenever sin does arise in our lives we should consider it to be a terrible development. After all sin is darkness and we are called to live in the light (see 1 John 1:7). Sin is such a terrible thing that we should be willing to cut off the parts of our body that are the cause of such sin (see Matthew 5:29-30). Sin is such a terrible thing because it is an offence against the beautiful holiness of God.

If we are aware of the vileness of sin what are we to do? We must confess it. We must acknowledge it for what it is and repent of it. I must say to God that I want an end of such terrible conduct in my life. Upon that confession we can know the cleansing of the blood of our Lord Jesus shed on the cross for us, we can know restoration of our relationship with the Lord and we can enjoy the Christ-obtained fellowship with our God. John puts it like this If we confess our sins, he

is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness (1 John 1:9)

If we consider that a Christian cannot sin we will end up twisting our minds and our souls. If we claim we have not sinned, we make him out to be a liar and his word is not in us (1 John 1:10). The sin which occurs in our lives will be defined in an alternative, lying way if we believe a Christian cannot sin. In so doing we make God a liar. To deny sin for what it is, is to act contrary to God's Word. So if we commit adultery, which is a sin and condemned in God's Word we will alternatively define it. Such an action leads a mess as we live in denial. Repentance which is the key that releases us into God's favour will be gone from our lives. So there will be no joyous fellowship with God (see 1 John 1:3-4).

In 1 John 2:1 John goes on to explain the mechanics of what happens in God working to keep us in a secure relationship with Him. My dear children, I write this to you so that you will not sin. But if anybody does sin, we have an advocate with the Father - Jesus Christ, the Righteous One. The basic issue is that we should not be sinning as Christians. In fact John will go on to say bluntly later in his letter that if we do just continue on in sin: No one who lives in him keeps on sinning. No one who continues to sin has either seen him or known him (1 John 3:6).

Sadly, all Christians have lapses into sin, although that is not how it should be. In such a case we have the joy of the fact that Jesus speaks up for us, as our advocate, right there in the presence of God. He has no sin of his own; He is righteous. But He pleads before the Father how He gave Himself for us; shedding His blood for our sins. As a result of His work on the cross being accepted by God to finish our sins so we are accepted by God. We can never lose our eternal blessings. Nothing, and that includes our sin, can eternally separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus.

So fellow Christian you should not sin. But if you do sin, repentance for your sin and knowing Jesus stands in heaven is all you need. Through this you know all is well (Jesus is in heaven for you) and you can experience that all is well through your repentance.
